Pathways to Digital Employment

Your route to securing a job in IT

e-skills UK, together with Welsh Government and local employers, is providing free training and skills development in the roles that Welsh employers are telling us they need to fill with new staff.

There are five courses to choose from and each one includes online IT training to be undertaken part time over a 10 week period (12 weeks in total with exam preparation), plus employability training at your local education and training provider.





What will I get?

- A choice of training in:
 - Network design, installation and operation
 - Software development
 - Technical support
 - Software testing
 - Database development
- Technical training delivered online, allowing you to study in your own time and around other commitments
- Employability skills training once a week at a local education and training provider, in areas such as CV writing and interview preparation
- A paid for exam in an industry recognised qualification relevant to the training you have done
- Mock test materials and a drop-in session by your local education and training provider during the two weeks in advance of your exam

What commitment is required from me?

As part of the course you will be required to:

- Undertake a number of hours of online training over a 10 week period (the amount of training is dependent on course choice)
- Spend one day a week at your local education and training provider to develop employability skills and receive additional advice on technical training
- Prepare for your exam using the online mock test materials and e-books provided
- Attend your exam

What criteria do I need to meet?

This free training course is open to anyone who is:

- Aged 16 or over
- Currently seeking employment and registered with Jobcentre Plus
- A Welsh resident
- Actively interested in a job in IT

Places are limited and subject to simple eligibility criteria so early application is recommended

What will I get at the end of it?

At the end of the training you will have increased your chances of getting a rewarding job in IT through:

- Achieving an industry recognised qualification in a role that is currently in demand by local employers
- · Improving your employability skills
- Networking with potential future employers via workshops
